Students view a series of current affairs programmes and focus on the issues and conventions.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Students analyse a current affair programme in class. Students watch programme and make notes. Notes are collected and analysis is written next day. Unseen question. Students produce a 2 page script of a current affairs program using a story board format that includes visuals, shot selection and captions. | Response / Investigation | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Novel Study. Focus on character, point of view, issues and ideas. In class response. Unseen question, ½ A4 page of quotes allowed. Television Drama Study. Investigate and respond to how topics, events and people are represented in both <u>The Shark Net</u> and <u>Jasper Jones</u>. In class response, unseen question, no notes allowed. | 15 15 | 30% | Term 3 Weeks 3 - 9 |
| Oral Participation / Production | <p>Analyse the representation of a well-known individual who has had an impact on the society of that time or in a later historical period:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The person’s context (time and place) – their stage The <u>language</u> and <u>stylistic</u> choices used to position the reader/viewer to respond in particular ways to the person How are you encouraged to see this individual and their impact – how influential have they been? His/her effect on the society of that time or a later historical period Compare and/or contrast the person’s values and/or attitudes with your own Use of aids/ props will enhance production.
